

### Why Invest in Quality Pre-K?

#### **Educational, Social and Economic Success**

☐ Better academic and social skills
☐ Reduced needs for special education and grade repetition
☐ Increased educational attainment
☐ Less problem behavior, delinquency, and crime
☐ Better adult life outcomes: employment, earnings, & health

# Unfortunately for even well-off families quality pre-K is hard to find and expensive






# NJ has a world-class pre-K program, but access is limited to 31 school districts

- Court ordered "Abbott" pre-K for 31 high needs districts with 25% of state's children
- High standards for learning and teaching
- Good teachers and small classes
- 6 hour educational day
- District administered public-private (60%) system
- Continuous improvement system ensures quality
- Research demonstrates program is effective




#### NJ's Abbott Pre-K Dramatically Raised Quality





# Test Scores Improved Substantially (achievement in grades 4 and 5)




■ 1 year Abbott pre-k

### **Moving Forward**



- 1. High Quality (HQ) Pre-K prepares children for success in school and life
- 2. New Jersey has a highly successful, **proven** Pre-K model, access is limited to 31 school districts
- 3. State legislation to offer the model to more children and families was passed in 2008, but never funded
- 4. The state just received a 4-year federal grant to increase access to its HQ Pre-K, this helps get us started
- 5. NJ should build on the federal grant to enable 1000's more NJ children to benefit for HQ Pre-K
- 6. NJ could save nearly \$600 million per year in K-12 alone by providing HQ Pre-k to all children under 200% FPL
